It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Infinite and Boundless God, who created all things and called them good. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

And then he took the wine that they were drinking – and he gave thanks for the wine, gave it to those gathered around the Table and said, "this is my cup – poured out for you - whenever you drink this, remember that you are loved and you are forgiven."

As we remember and give thanks, we pray we might also join God's work of reconciliation and forgiveness, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here today, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us signs of God's love and forgiveness. Transform our lives that we may also be a sign of that love and forgiveness in our homes, in our neighbourhoods, and in the world. Amen.

Red Dress Day

May 5, Red Dress Day, is Canada's National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two Spirit People (MMIWG2S). The day awakens our attention to the 1200+ missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls, and two spirit people. The use of a red dress was inspired by

Métis artist Jaime Black in 2010 and represents the pain and loss felt by loved ones and survivors. Today we welcome Gloria Snow. Gloria Snow is the daughter of the late Dr. Rev. Chief John Snow and Alva Snow from the Stoney Nakoda First Nation. Gloria continues her work as a traditional knowledge holder, teacher and cultural advocate. Gloria is a Student Minister completing her M.Div at the Vancouver School of Theology and has 15 years of experience working as a Life skills Coach, Holistic Wellness Coach, Domestic Violence interventionist and traditional parenting instructor. Gloria is committed to working with reconciliation initiatives and our United Churches.

- Indigenous women are 12 times more likely to be murdered or missing than all other women in Canada.
- Between 2009 2021, 490 Indigenous women and girls were the victims of homicide.
- Indigenous women are two times more likely than non-Indigenous women to have experienced sexual abuse by an adult before the age of 15.

Knox Commemorates The Battle of the Atlantic, 1939-1945

Every year on the first Sunday in May, the Canadian Navy family gathers to commemorate the Battle of the Atlantic – to honour the struggle, sacrifice, and loss, but also to celebrate the heroism and courage in the face of daunting obstacles: horrible weather and high seas, rough little ships and cramped quarters, and the ever-present threat of attack by submarines lurking below.

The importance of the Battle of the Atlantic simply can't be overstated: it is universally acknowledged that without victory in the Atlantic, Allied victory in the Second World War would not have been possible. On this day we remember those men and women who served in the Royal Canadian Navy, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve and the Canadian Merchant Marine who came from all over Canada.

The flags in the sanctuary this morning are the Canadian Naval Ensign which is flown from the stern of all H.M.C.S. ships and the church pennant; which is flown during religious services on board naval vessels and in establishments. There is also a bell. In today's Canadian Navy the ship's bell finds limited use in a ceremonial role at Colours (0800) and, on occasion, it is turned upside down for use as a baptismal font. The name of a baptized child is inscribed on the rim of the bell.

Knox Foundation "Special Meeting"

A Knox Foundation "Special Meeting" will be held on Sunday, May 12th, following the worship service for the purpose of considering a special resolution to amend the Knox Foundation Bylaws. After consultation with the United Church of Canada, the Knox Foundation Directors concluded that the change in the Foundation's supervising authority from the Knox congregation to the Chinook Winds region incorporated in the "approved" bylaws in November, 2023 is not suitable. The Directors are proposing reverting to the accountability structure that was in place since the inception of the Foundation in 1987. A copy of the proposed by-laws will be available in the church office in advance of the meeting.
