UPDATE FROM THE KNOX COMMISSION/GOVERNING BODY

On behalf of the Knox Commission, we hope you all had a Happy Easter, and are enjoying the spring weather. The Knox Commission is looking for ideas to rename the Knox Governing Body and its working groups. Ideas were collected at the April 2nd potluck lunch. There is still time to submit further ideas to any member of the Commission/Governing Body.

The names will be voted on at the May 28th Congregational Meeting.

The Knox Commission met on March 28th. Highlights from this meeting were:

- · Kay de la Ronde is the Grant and Strategic Partnership Liaison with the Finance and Stewardship Working Group.
- · Plans on event coordination are underway. The job description for Event Coordinator is being fine-tuned, with the view to have a person in place by September.
 - · Opportunity Knox is advertising for a Knox Representative to the Chinook Winds Region.
- · Janet Zatka reported on the February finances: Total Revenues are higher than the same time last year by \$11,502, Total Expenses are slightly higher than the same time last year by \$3,290, and the bank overdraft is less than the same time last year by \$13,196. As we regroup following the challenges of the pandemic, things are beginning to move in the right direction.
 - · Meetings are taking place to move forward with the Mission and Vision.
 - · Plans to deal with security issues are underway.
 - · Opportunity Knox continues to search for a Chair of Finance and Stewardship.

Applications have been submitted for grants from the federal government and the United Church of Canada Foundation. Applying for these grants was part of the 2023 Budget plan approved by congregation at the congregational meeting on February 26, 2023. The outcomes of the applications will not be known until early summer. This work was completed with help from many during the information gathering and preparation process.
