CALGARY ALLIANCE FOR THE COMMON GOOD SEPTEMBER UPDATE

Issues Facing Calgary

(1) Poverty:

Of great concern to most Calgarians is the steep increase in rates of poverty in Calgary, as measured by food bank usage, rates of homelessness, & rising mental health issues among the population. As winter approaches, many people who are now considered poor, but who have been merely 'getting by' in cramped housing, and with occasional added help from the Food Bank, will no longer be able to pay for food, or rent, or heat. A number of organizations are trying to tackle the problem of poverty in our city, in coalition with the Calgary Alliance. The overall strategy of all of these organizations is called **Enough For All**. The strategy is supported by the Alliance for the Common Good, The Calgary Foundation, & Calgary City Council.

Vibrant Communities Calgary belongs to the Alliance, and has created a podcast called "Let's Talk Poverty". You can get the podcast at www.enoughforall.ca through Apple Podcasts, Spotify, and Google Podcasts.

The Canadian Poverty Institute is housed within Ambrose University and its director is Derek Cook. Previously, Derek worked at City Hall, leading the Mayor's Task Force on Poverty Reduction. This is a research and advocacy institute, seeking to find workable solutions to poverty across Canada. It is a member of the Calgary Alliance for the Common Good. The vision of the Poverty Institute is for "a just and compassionate society where the material, social and spiritual gifts and needs of all people are realized." Derek Cook has written a very good analysis of the connections among community organizing, human rights principles, moral philosophy, and faith-based action, and the need for all these ways of thinking and acting to end the cycles of poverty in: 'The Art of Hope: Healing the Wounded City' (available through Amazon, or through the Canadian Bible Society).
