God is with us.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Infinite and Boundless God, who created all things and called them good. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy one, God of love and majesty, the whole universe speaks of your glory and creativity, your loving embrace.

Blest is the one who comes in the name of the Source of Love and Light. Holy are you, and blessed is your child, Jesus Christ.

We remember that it was around a table that Jesus gathered his disciples during his last week of life. Jesus reminded them that God's vision was about forgiveness and loving our neighbours as ourselves – encountering each person as God's very own.

Welcome Ethan Hill, Interim Director of Music

We welcome Ethan Hill as Interim Director of Music as Chellan Hoffman takes a renewal leave. Ethan studied composition at the University of Victoria, where he also trained as a liturgical musician at St. John the Divine Anglican Church. In 2019, he relocated to Montreal to study the organ at McGill University, during which time he held an organ scholarship at Christ Church Cathedral. His work in the church sparked his fascination with metaphysics, symbolism and ontology, which he continues to explore today. He works with the Alberta Ballet and the Savridi Singers. He continues to develop his artistry through residencies with the Banff Centre for Art and Creativity, the Domaine Forget de Charlevoix and Continuum Contemporary Music. Ethan also serves as president of RCCO, Calgary Centre and a representative for Alberta & the Northwest Territories with the Canadian League of Composers.
