



HOLY COMMUNION

God is with us!

We are not alone!

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to God.

Let us give thanks to the One who invites us to the Table.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Infinite and Boundless God, who created all things and called them good. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy one, God of love and majesty, the whole universe speaks of your glory. Blest is the one who comes in the name of the Source of Love and Light.

Holy are you, and blessed is your child, Jesus Christ.

We remember that it was around a table that Jesus gathered his disciples during his last week of life. Jesus reminded them of the work that he had done – how he had fed the hungry, included the outcast, challenged the status quo. He reminded them that God's vision was about forgiveness and loving our neighbours as ourselves – encountering each person as God's very own.

And, as they sat and ate and remembered, Jesus took the bread that they were eating – and he gave thanks, he broke the bread, gave it to everyone gathered around the Table, and said, "take and eat – this is my body, broken for you. Whenever you eat of this bread, remember me."

And then he took the wine that they were drinking – and he gave thanks for the wine, gave it to those gathered around the Table and said, "this is my cup – poured out for you - whenever you drink this, remember that you are loved and you are forgiven."

As we remember and give thanks, we pray we might also join God's work of reconciliation and forgiveness, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here today, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us signs of God's love and forgiveness. Transform our lives that we may also be a sign of that love and forgiveness in our homes, in our neighbourhoods, and in the world. **Amen.**

<u>Music Notes:</u> We welcome guest organist (and Knox Choir member) Leslie Smith to the service this morning. Leslie Smith was born in Calgary to musical parents and sang in church choirs

and played the organ from a young age. Robert Hunter Bell was an early influence and eventually he studied organ at University of Calgary with John Searchfield. An interest in wood working from his Father helped him through the assembly of his first harpsichord at age 16. Along the way Stuart Kennedy also nurtured a strong interest in the interior workings of organs and in 1973 Leslie became an apprentice organ builder with <u>Gabriel Kney and Co</u> in London Ontario. By the end of the decade they'd built several new tracker organs in Alberta including Christ Church Anglican, Calgary and Robertson-Wesley United, Edmonton, as well as 40 or so trackers for American clients.

In 1982 Leslie joined Gerhard Brunzema in Fergus Ontario. Upon Mr B's untimely passing in 1992 Leslie established his own workshop where he built and repaired organs until retiring back to Calgary in December 2022.
