We welcome William Brook today! William is joining Knox as a Vancouver School of Theology intern. As part of his internship he will be preaching and leading worship for the next few weeks. William spent most of his life as a geneticist, most recently as a professor at the University of Calgary. But after following a midlife call, he is a candidate for ordained ministry in the United Church of Canada and a Master of Divinity student at the Vancouver School of Theology. William is interested in how spiritual practises can transform lives and communities and leads the Contemplative Ministry at Hillhurst United Church. He lives in West Hillhurst with his partner Darolyn and Hudson the dog. They have three grown children and three grandchildren.

♥ **Music Notes about the Prelude** Anishinaabe composer **Beverley McKiver** is a pianist, composer and teacher. Her compositions explore themes of connection to the land, identity, and recovery of Indigenous knowledge. This particular movement – “Aupilaktunnguat”– is the Inuit name for Purple Saxifrage. This flower grows on rocky ground and is the first to bloom in the Arctic spring. It is Nunavut’s floral emblem. In this piece, Beverley explores the imagery of the little pink/purple Saxifrage flowers, and the Arctic seasons of Spring, Summer, Fall, and the Aurora Borealis.

WEEKLY Connection and Reflection (Wednesday Worship):

12:30-1:30 pm, Labyrinth Room Join us for a time of reflection and conversation. Held in the beautiful Labyrinth Room, framed with music, readings, and a time for silence and quiet reflection, we will come together to listen, to talk, and to be in community together. All are welcome.

Sermon Series: God’s Shalom and the Harmony Way: The Harmony Way is a spirituality lived out by Indigenous peoples around the world. In the Harmony Way, we remember that we are all connected to each other, to the land, to all forms of life, and to the divine. We are meant to share the earth and live together in cooperation and peace. What does this have to do with our Christian story? That is what we will explore in a four-sermon series based on the book *God’s Shalom and the Community of Creation* by Cherokee pastor and professor Dr. Randy Woodley.

Making Sacred Connections: Building Community

All activities are facilitated by engaged and active leaders that are focused on making sure all children feel included and accepted for who they are. Volunteer Opportunity - SoberCrew (August 1-3) Knox will be hosting the SoberCrew, August 1-3. The SoberCrew is an Indigenous-led group that supports people in recovery. They are walking from Morley to Calgary to raise awareness of addiction and the challenges their communities face. We met members of the SoberCrew at the Maundy Thursday Feast in Morley. Knox is honoured to provide overnight accommodations for the group while they are in Calgary. We are partnering with other faith communities and congregations to provide meals. If you would like to volunteer to help with meals and clean-up, please contact Holly Smith through the church office.

English Language Learning at Knox Knox will be offering drop-in English language classes for adults on a drop-in basis beginning at the end of July. These classes will be led by volunteer instructors/tutors—preferably with training and experience. This initiative is in response to a need arising from the influx of immigrants and refugees that Calgary is experiencing. Unfortunately, many of these individuals are experiencing huge delays in accessing necessary assistance with language learning. Not only will these classes at Knox give students the opportunity to practice conversational English, but they will also provide other support. We want to provide an opportunity for newcomers to gather in a relaxed, non-structured setting and to discuss and ask questions regarding unknowns and complexities of life in a new country and new culture.

These support classes at Knox are scheduled to begin on Monday, July 31. The first session will run for five weeks on Mondays and Thursdays from 1:30 PM - 3:30 PM. The present plan is that the second session will begin on September 11 and will run for five weeks on Mondays and Thursdays from 3:30 PM - 5:30 PM.

Although the classes are free, a registration fee of \$20 will be requested to assist with operating costs. The initial focus of the classes will be support for beginner to intermediate conversational English (listening, speaking, and vocabulary). However, we are also planning to provide assistance for intermediate writing and grammar if a demand becomes apparent.

We will be seeking tutors—especially with training/experience—and we will also be seeking ways to spread the word that this assistance is available. For further information, please speak to Dennis Ruf or email EnglishatKnox@gmail.com.
