

#### **HOLY COMMUNION**

God is with us.

We are not alone.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to God.

Let us give thanks to the One who is

boundless in hospitality and who invites us to the Table.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Infinite and Boundless God, who created all things and called them good. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy one, God of love and majesty, the whole universe speaks of your glory and creativity, your loving embrace.

Blest is the one who comes in the name of the Source of Love and Light. Holy are you, and blessed is your child, Jesus Christ.

We remember that it was around a table that Jesus gathered his disciples during his last week of life. Jesus reminded them that God's vision was about forgiveness and loving our neighbours as ourselves – encountering each person as God's very own.

## **Welcome Rev. Yolanda Norton**

We are pleased to welcome Rev. Yolanda Norton as part of the Affirming Leader's weekend. Rev. Norton is the Executive Director of the Global Arts and Theology Experience (GATE) and the creator of Beyoncé Mass! Prior to her current positions she served as a Visiting Professor at the Seminary of the Southwest as well as Assistant Professor of Hebrew Bible and H. Eugene Farlough Chair of Black Church Studies at San Francisco Theological Seminary.

Her womanist scholarship explores how Scripture treats foreign women and how this has led to the oppression of Black women who encounter the Bible today. She is a PhD candidate in Hebrew Bible and Ancient Israel and Theology and Practice Fellow at Vanderbilt University. Rev. Norton is also ordained in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and she holds a Master of Divinity and Master of Theological Studies degree from Wesley Theological Seminary and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Syracuse University.
